Expressions of Interest	A concept note/application submitted by a civil society organization to express its interest in partnership with the UN.
Financial statement audit	Also known as an external audit, refers to an audit undertaken by an external auditor to provide independent assurance that an organization's management has, in its financial statements, presented a "true and fair" view of the organization's financial performance and position.
Governing document	A formal document with information about the structure and governance of an organization, outlining the purposes of the organization and how it will be run. A governing document may come in the form of a trust deed, constitution, memorandum and articles of association, or another formal legal document.
HQ Profile	The profile created in UN Partner Portal for the headquarters of an international NGO (INGO), providing a description of the organization as a whole
Internal audit	An independent, objective assurance and consulting activity that is undertaken by either an organization's own employees or an external auditor, to evaluate the effectiveness of an organization's risk management, control and governance processes.
International Non- Governmental Organization (INGO)	A non-governmental organization that has offices in more than one country.
